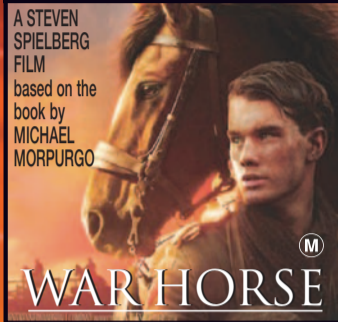

When they are forcefully parted, the film follows the extraordinary journey of the horse as he moves through the war - an odyssey of joy and sorrow, passionate friendship and high adventure. A GAME OF SHADOWS

Guy Ritchie returns with Robert Downey Jr. and Jude Law in the follow up to the 2009 hit, *Sherlock Holmes*. Holmes has always been the smartest man in the room... until now. There is a new criminal mastermind at large - Professor Moriarty (Jarrod Harris) - and not only is he Holmes' intellectual equal, but his capacity for evil, coupled with a complete lack of conscience, may actually give him an advantage over the renowned detective. Although it owes little to the stories of Arthur Conan Doyle, the chemistry of the two leads make this a wildly entertaining romp. Noomi Rapace, from the Swedish *Dragon Tattoo* films, joins them in this latest escapade. (M) 128mins

HUGO

Martin Scorsese adapts Brian Selznick's fanciful tale of childhood intrigue and adventure (*The Invention of Hugo Cabret*) for the screen. Hugo tells the story of an orphan boy living a secret life in the walls of a Paris train station. With the help of an eccentric girl, he searches for the answer to a mystery linking the father he recently lost, the ill-tempered toy shop owner living below him and a heart shaped lock, seemingly without a key. Nominated for 11 Academy Awards, including Best Film, it stars Ben Kingsley, Sasha Baron Cohen and Asa Butterfield as Hugo. (PG) 126mins

From Alexander Payne, the creator of *Sideways* and *Election*, comes a sometimes humorous, sometimes tragic journey of an indifferent husband and father (George Clooney), who is forced to re-examine his past when his wife suffers a boating accident off Waikiki. The event causes him to wrestle with a decision to sell the family's land handed down from Hawaiian royalty and missionaries. This is one of the best reviewed films of the year and a sure contender during the upcoming awards season. Nominated for 5 Academy Awards including Best Picture and Best Actor. (M) 115mins

However, when a disgraced agent reappears with information concerning a mole at the heart of MI6, Smiley is drawn back into the murky field of espionage. Based on John Le Carré's 1970s Cold War spy novel and the BBC miniseries starring Alec Guinness, Tomas Alfredson (*Let The Right One In*) directs a stellar cast including last year's Oscar-winner Colin Firth, Tom Hardy, John Hurt, Benedict Cumberbatch, Toby Jones and Mark Strong. JOHNNY DEPP
HUNTER S. THOMPSON'S
THE RUM DIARY

The year is 1960, the city is San Juan, Puerto Rico, and the nostalgia is all ring-a-ding-ding. Johnny Depp is Paul Kemp - a portrait of his gonzo creator, Hunter S. Thompson, in all but name. This story about the exotic misadventures of a young journalist from Thompson's semi-autobiographical first novel is reworked, primarily as an origin story with the first stirrings of the writer's voice as his political consciousness grows fangs (enter his nemesis, Richard Nixon). Director Bruce Robinson knows debauchery well - he made the hysterical *Withnail & I* - and Depp's reaction to swigging home-made rum is worth the the ticket alone. And yes, there will be drugs. ANY QUESTIONS FOR BEN?

For 27-year-old Ben (Josh Lawson), life couldn't be better. But when he is invited back to his old school to join several others for a student Q&A about their personal achievements, something goes wrong. Ben is the only speaker not to be asked a question. This triggers a year of soul-searching and looking for answers in all the wrong places. Soon he begins to suspect that the meaning of life may well reside in the things he's already doing - and a girl he once knew (Rachael Taylor). THE BEST EXOTIC MARIGOLD HOTEL

Enticed by advertisements for the newly restored Marigold Hotel they arrive to find their accommodation a shell of its former self. Though the new environment is less luxurious than imagined, they are forever transformed by their shared experiences. This is a joyous and entertaining film from the director of *Shakespeare in Love* about how the human spirit remains undimmed. (PG) 123mins

SALMON FISHING IN THE YEMEN

From the director of *Chocolat* and the screenwriter of *Slumdog Millionaire* comes the inspirational comedy based on Paul Torday's novel. When Britain's leading fisheries expert (Ewan McGregor) is approached by a consultant (Emily Blunt) to help realize a sheikh's (Amr Waked) vision of bringing the sport of fly-fishing to the desert, he immediately thinks the project is absurd and unachievable. But when the Prime Minister's overzealous press secretary (Kristin Scott Thomas) latches on to it as a 'good will' story, this unlikely team will put it all on the line and embark on an upstream journey of faith and fish to prove the impossible, possible. 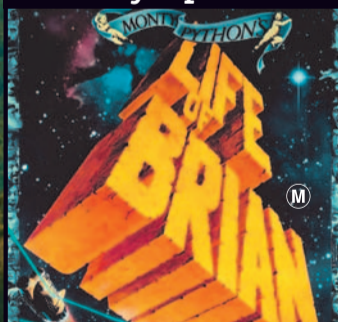

THE MUPPETS

The Muppets are back in all their stupendous glory. Jason Segal, his Muppet brother Walter and Amy Adams (along with a number of inspired cameos) seek out Kermit the Frog to get him to raise money in order to save the old Muppet Theatre and bring his whole Muppet gang together again. (okay, it's the Blues... sorry Muppet Brothers) The musical numbers are enormously catchy (And Oscar nominated) and most importantly, the Muppets are just as wild, witty and wonderful as they ever were before. There is cause for celebration indeed - and not just for kids - this is a funny, wickedly self-aware comedy. Everyone will love it. (G) 102mins

Monty Python's irreverent satire of biblical films and religious intolerance is probably the funniest British comedy ever. The film pokes jabs at every religious convention so in this highly inappropriate night join the rest of the Pythons - John Cleese, Michael Palin, Eric Idle and Terry Gilliam - in remembering... *Blessed are the cheese-makers!* (M) 94mins

THE GIRL ON THE TRAIN

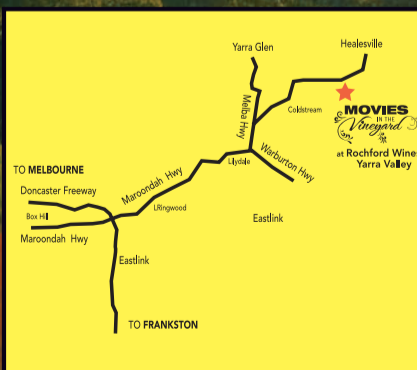
This new version of Stieg Larsson's literary blockbuster, *The Millennium Trilogy*, is directed by David Fincher (*The Social Network*) and stars Daniel Craig and Rooney Mara in her Oscar-nominated role. It is a murder mystery looking back 40 years at the disappearance of the youngest heir of one of Sweden's wealthiest families. All these years later, her aged uncle (Christopher Plummer) continues to seek the truth. Investigating is Mikael Blomkvist (Daniel Craig), a crusading journalist, aided by the pierced and tattooed punk prodigy Lisbeth Salander. The film co-stars Stellan Skarsgård, Steven Berkoff and Robin Wright. (MA15+) 158mins

In 1956, 23 year-old Colin Clark (Eddie Redmayne) is determined to make his way in the film business. Gaining employment on the UK set of *The Prince and The Showgirl*, the film that famously united Sir Laurence Olivier and Marilyn Monroe (Kenneth Branagh & Michelle Williams - both nominated for Oscars). Clark could never anticipate the job that lay ahead of him. When Monroe's husband Arthur Miller leaves England, the coast is clear for the star to enjoy some of the pleasures of British life. Upon the publication of Clark's diary 40 years later, one week was missing from the text. This is the incredible true story of that week. (M) 99mins
